PLEASE READ THE INFORMATION BELOW ABOUT SUMMIT LUNCH PROGRAM POLICIES:

- 1. SPOTS ARE NOT GUARANTEED.** If interest exceeds program capacity, participants will be chosen by lottery. If you don't get a spot, you will be given priority in the same program next term. If the same program is not offered again, you will be given priority in ONE program of your choice next term. Forms **MUST** be received by the deadline to participate in any lotteries or to receive priority next term. Your child's participation in the requested programs will be confirmed with you by email on or around April 5, 2019.
- 2. PROGRAMS RUN WEEKLY FOR SPECIFIED NUMBER OF WEEKS.** Students must register for the full term. Fees cannot be pro-rated for family vacations or other absences. There are no make-up sessions, and refunds will not be given for missed sessions.
- 3. REGISTRATION FEES:** You must submit **ONE CHEQUE PER CHILD PER PROGRAM** payable to "Summit Heights School Council". Cheques are due by ***Tuesday, April 2, 2019***. Online payment is NOT available at this time. If you need financial assistance to participate, please speak to Mr. Mah or your child's teacher by April 2, 2019. If your payment or a request for financial assistance is not received by the due date, your spot will be offered to any children on the wait list, and your registration may be cancelled.
- 4. BEHAVIOUR POLICY:** All programs require that students listen, behave respectfully, cooperate with instructors, follow rules, participate in activities and help to clean up. If there are behaviour concerns, parents will be contacted. If a parent has to be contacted more than twice, the student will not be allowed to continue in the program. **NO REFUND** will be given to a student removed from a program due to poor behaviour.
- 5. REFUND POLICY:** If a student is not happy in a program, a refund may be requested prior to 5pm on the day before the START of the 2nd class. **NO refunds will be given after the second class.**
- 6. “FREE” LUNCH PROGRAMS:** Summit teachers may offer some “free” teacher-run lunch programs or clubs in addition to the lunch programs coordinated by School Council. Details regarding these programs will be communicated directly by the teachers involved when they are available.

TUESDAYS (Apr 16- Jun 4)

Primary FIMO by Wanda's Creative Clay! (Gr 1-3) \$140

A long-time Summit family favourite! Your child will learn to turn FIMO clay into amazing creations designed by Wanda. Kids will improve their fine motor skills, work on patience and confidence, learn about colours and math and experience just old fashioned "having fun."

Engineering & Team Building Challenges (Gr 1-6) \$140

Students will work together to design, build and customize a variety of LEGO Creations, while learning a new engineering skill each week. Students will also be put to the test, as they compete in a variety of team building & problem solving challenges throughout the program. Activities Include: The Egg Drop Challenge, The Marble Ball Race, Lego Building Challenges, Sphero Robot Problem Solving, and MORE. Skills developed throughout this program include problem solving, communication, creativity, leadership, teamwork, planning, and science & math.

Home Made Gifts (Gr 1-4) \$145

"Made with Love" gifts are a growing trend, yet you don't have to be a Pinterest connoisseur to make spectacular gifts for your loved ones! In this class we will make unique gifts that you can give to your family and friends (or even keep for yourself!). From spa treatments to edible treats and artsy crafts, you will learn how to make it all! Join us in Homemade Gifts and get ready to give the best holiday and birthday presents EVER!

THURSDAYS (Apr 18- Jun 6)

Sphero Robotics & Coding 2.0 (Gr 1-3) \$140

A continuation of Sphero 101 (offered last fall), this One-Of-A-Kind program, ***open to new and returning students***, introduces students to the fun and exciting world of robotics and coding.

Throughout the program, students will be amazed as they explore how to program, customize, and control 3 different Sphero Robots while learning a variety of basic, intermediate, and advanced techniques along the way! Students will also be put to the test using the Lighting Lab APP as they compete in several SPHERO Robotic challenges & competitions. Examples include: The Ultimate Programmer, The SUPER MAZE, Robot Bowling, Sphero Golf, LEGO Chariot Races, Custom built Terrain Parks, Obstacle Courses & MORE!

Money Managers (Gr 4-6) \$145

The course that turns learning basic financial literacy upside down – from boring and tedious, to fun and inspiring! Be warned, however, that this program will also turn your home life upside down – from “Mom, Dad, give me money,” to “Mom, Dad, give me money for my RESP!”

Major topics include:

- DEBT: What is it? How does it all work? Who exactly do I owe money to?
- Credit scores, credit cards, student loans, lines of credit, mortgages, payday loans, and taxes are thoroughly examined.

Also covered: what it really costs parents to keep their little darlings clothed, fed, and programmed for one year, as well as an outline of life’s big expenses, like education, real estate and retirement.

In an era filled with unrelenting consumer advertising, false images of financial success, and easily accessible credit, this course teaches students how to be financial leaders, not financial victims; to be true to who they are when they manage their finances; and to understand how their financial choices impact not only their own lives in the short and long term, but also the world around them.
